Making your Home Accessible

Have you been an NLHC tenant for a number of years and find that with age comes a need for accessibility modifications to your home? NLHC may be able to assist you if your home meets eligibility requirements. Following is a list of typical accessibility modifications and how to go about requesting them:

- Grab bars, handheld showers and dehumidifiers please contact your maintenance department. There is no need for a medical note for these items and tenants will not be referred back to their Housing Officer.
- Flooring, higher toilette seats, lever handles on doors and taps and special hand rails — please contact your Housing Officer and be prepared to provide a medical note. Your Housing Officer will deal with the Maintenance Department regarding your request.
- 3) Full showers/bathroom modifications, ramps, or other complicated requests please contact your Housing Officer who will forward these requests on for Social Work Assessment and follow up.

Please note that not all homes are eligible to be made accessible. NLHC will not provide ramps or extensively modify bathrooms/kitchens in units that cannot be made fully accessible even with modifications. P

5K Family Fun Run/ Walk for Literacy

The Community Centre Alliance held it's 6th Annual Youth Achieve 5K Family Run/Walk on August 14, 2016, at Quidi Vidi Lake in St. John's. The event was a huge success. The Alliance was able to raise approximately \$10,000 with 283 participants! This fundraiser contributes
